With the festive period now well and truly upon us, I would just like to remind you of some basic crime prevention advice for keeping yourself and your belongings safe—whether shopping, socialising or at home. During December, opportunist thieves have far more criminal options than at other times of the year. Simple preventative measures will keep you safe and (hopefully) happy during this festive time.

- **Keep presents out of sight of doors and windows and don't leave packaging for new electrical goods on display outside your house.**
- **If you are away over the festive period, make sure that your house looks occupied by using timer switches for lights and radios.**
- **Ask a neighbour to keep an eye on your house.**
- **If you are Christmas shopping, remember to keep your handbags and wallets close to you and secure.**
- **Make sure doors are locked and windows are secure—even if you are in another part of the property.**
- **If you are buying valuable items this Christmas, make sure you get them logged on www.immobilise.com**
- **Don't leave shopping, gifts or other valuables on display in your car.**

- Stay alert & walk confidently, ideally with someone else or in a group.
- Use busy, well-lit streets
- Avoid wearing headphones or chatting on your mobile phone.
- Carry a personal safety alarm
- Keep your valuables out of sight.
- Plan your route ahead.
- Use only licensed mini-cabs or Taxis
