

## Keynsham Civic Centre to host next PCC & Police Public Forum

Residents of Avon and Somerset are invited to put their questions to Police and Crime Commissioner Sue Mountstevens and Assistant Chief Constable Steve Cullen on Wednesday 19 June, 2019.

The public forum, which will be held in The Auditorium at Keynsham Civic Centre and One Stop Shop, will be attended by Avon and Somerset's PCC, Assistant Chief Constable Steven Cullen and Neighbourhood Inspector Gavin Usher.

The forum will begin with a welcome from the PCC and Assistant Chief Constable before a presentation on policing in the area by Neighbourhood Inspector Gavin Usher. Following this, there will be an open question and answer session with the PCC, Assistant Chief Constable and Inspector.

Speaking ahead of the forum, PCC Sue Mountstevens said: "I am delighted to return to Keynsham for this public forum. It's a fantastic opportunity to meet with local people and those from the surrounding areas.

"I really look forward to these forums as the Assistant Chief Constable and I can speak to local people, find out what they think about policing in the area and answer any questions they may have. Local people tell me that they see these meetings as an opportunity to share their concerns and to help make the communities of Avon and Somerset safer and stronger."

Assistant Chief Constable Steve Cullen added: "These public forums are a brilliant opportunity to hear, first-hand, how local people feel about their police service and neighbourhood policing teams. It provides a chance for us to talk face-to-face about some of the challenges we are facing in policing and how our local communities can help us."

The forum will be held at The Auditorium, Keynsham Civic Centre and One Stop Shop, Market Walk, Keynsham, BS31 1FS and will take place between 7pm – 9pm on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2019.
