As the very busy Summer comes to an end I would like to introduce you to the new Neighbourhood Policing Support Team so you know what we do and how we can help.

Last April the pre-existing Local Policing Support Teams merged to become the Force wide Neighbourhood Policing Support Team with responsibility for Crime Prevention and Reduction , Crime Prevention Carpenters , Licensing , Restorative Justice , Rural Crime, Citizens in Policing and of course Neighbourhood Watch.

Together with Sergeants Nigel Chapman and Jon Hill, I manage the team Constabulary wide to ensure that we work together to deal with the matters that most affect our communities, and also that there is continued local buy-in and support, as each geographical area has its own unique issues and concerns. Key to this is Lindsey who will continue to provide her usual unwavering support to Somerset Neighbourhood Watch, and do her best to link in with the rest of the Team to make sure Somerset residents feel safe and be safe

Another significant development is the formal establishment of the National Neighbourhood Watch Association within Avon and Somerset. SEASONAL ADVICE

From our Crime Reduction Officer

Prepare for the end of British Summer Time (BST) by looking at and checking your lights (interior and exterior) and timers.

Your timers will need adjusting to Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) and also adjusted to take into account the shorter days and longer nights.

Review your exterior lighting (burglars do not like lights). If you currently use high wattage conventional lighting, think about switching to LED 'dusk till dawn' units. Bear in mind that bright lights create dark shadows, shadows that somebody can hide in. LED lights are very reliable and very cheap to run at about 1p a day.

It will depend on the situation but in the majority of locations we now recommend 'dusk till dawn' lighting over reactive lighting.



Please also take the opportunity to check security of sheds, garages and outbuildings to ensure that locks are in good working order. This includes checking doors and windows and consider securing larger items (such as pedal cycles, mowers, chain saws etc) within the building by anchoring to the floor or wall.

Halloween evening can cause concern for some residents and they prefer not to have callers at their door during the dark evenings. TELEPHONE SERVICES
